Accessibility Information

- There are safe, walking and cycling routes to Heron School, the number 2 bus stops near the school entrance and the number 8 bus stops on Abbeymead Avenue at the Turmut Hoer, about 15 minutes walk from the school so we encourage you to walk, cycle or use public transport if possible;
- There is some parking at the school site for those who have to drive
- Heron School is fully accessible, being step-free and with disabled-access toilets
- We will have a small room where parents can sit to feed babies or take children with SEND to sit quietly.

What will we be doing?

Below is an outline of what our day will look like:

Time	Activity
10.30am	Welcome and choice of (a) Crafts: (1) Handprint calendars (2) Fabric butterfly in a cocoon (3) "Wise Man" (4) Snowflake – folding and cutting and/or (b) (Weather-permitting) games outdoor on playground\
11.30am	Snacks: chopped fruit Optional indoor fun exercise to "Go Noodle " videos Short interactive Bible story (you can just listen! Joining in is optional)

12:45am	2 course cooked lunch served in the main hall: (i) To be Confirmed (ii) Sticky toffee pudding
After lunch	Lively party games in the main hall to finish the session
